Tioga and the surrounding area has much to offer residents and tourists alike. From a challenging nine-hole grass-greens course to numerous city parks with tennis courts and baseball diamonds to the Tioga and McGregor Dams north of town, quality outdoor spaces are abundant. Hunting & Camping



Fall is an exciting time of year with an abundance of hunting opportunities including deer, pheasant, duck and geese. Hunters from all over the country flock to our area to bag their limit. North Fork Lodge, a 6,000 square-foot lodge five miles north of Tioga, offers upland, waterfowl, and deer hunting packages, golf packages, cattle branding & horseback riding, snowmobiling, fishing and more. In the winter, ice fishing is only 30 miles away on beautiful Lake Sakakawea.

Hunting and Fishing Season Information

Deer (bow): late August through early January

Deer (gun): early November through mid-November

Small/Upland Game: mid-September through early January

Ring-necked pheasant: mid-October through early January

Fishing season: opens early April
